## II. FOREWORD

This year has brought meaningful results of our efforts and added to our family of donors and partners in the form of new CSR collaborations and project expansions. It has been a year of growth — measured not only in numbers, but in the depth of our reach and the resilience of our teams.

The Target Intervention among Injectable Drug Users project completed its first full year (April 2024 – March 2025) in Ajmer. Our teams reached 569 individuals who inject drugs — 113.8% of the target — through consistent outreach, peer educator networks, and the Drop-in Centre. Six new HIV-positive individuals were identified and five were linked to ART services.

We are also proud to announce our new partnership with Cochin Shipyard Ltd (CSL), Kochi, whose CSR grant of ₹40 Lakh is funding the Aarogyam Community Health Centre — a 1,500 sq. ft. purpose-built facility that will offer health, nutrition, and de-addiction services to vulnerable families in Hathikhera. Construction has progressed steadily since January 2025 and the centre is on track for commissioning by the end of 2025.

At Bal Sansar Public School, we are proud that the 2024-25 session welcomed 151 students — our highest enrolment in the school, post covid. All Grade 5 and Grade 8 students who appeared in the RBSE board examinations passed with 100% result. The school continues to provide quality education to children from the most marginalised households of Hathikhera and surrounding villages.

Much of our progress this year is possible only because of the untiring and selfless work of our project teams, volunteers, community workers, and Governing Board members. We also thank our donors and partners — RSACS, Cochin Shipyard Ltd, U and N Foundation, Smile Foundation, Mitsubishi Elevator India, Tata Trent, and GiveIndia — for their continued trust and support.

## IV. CURRENT PROJECTS

### a. Bal Sansar Public School (BSPS)



*Bal Sansar Public School campus, Hathikhera, Ajmer — Session 2024-25*

Bal Sansar Public School (BSPS), established in April 2013 in Hathikhera village, Ajmer district, is now in its 13th year of operation. The school provides quality English and Hindi medium education from Nursery to Grade 8, primarily serving children from marginalised households — including landless labourers, daily-wage workers, and families living in poverty — in Hathikhera and surrounding villages.

Session 2024-25 saw 151 students enrolled — the highest in the school's history. A grant of ₹4.5 Lakh from the U and N Foundation (New Delhi) supported staff salaries during the year. Two smart classrooms equipped with digital boards, funded by Mitsubishi Elevator India Pvt. Ltd., continue to enhance digital learning.

- 100% pass rate — all Grade 5 and Grade 8 students who appeared in the 2024-25 RBSE board examinations passed.

- Safe, clean, filtered water and separate boys' and girls' toilets maintained.

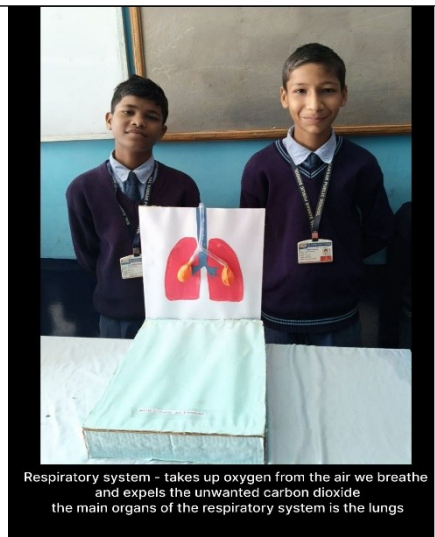

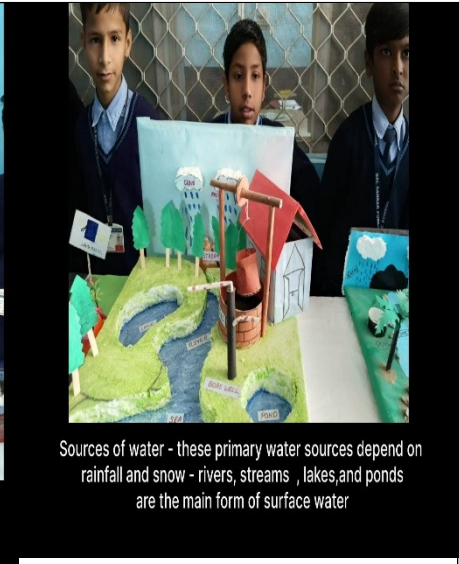

## b. Target Intervention (TI) — Injectable Drug Users (IDU), Ajmer

The Target Intervention among Injectable Drug Users (TI-IDU) project, funded by the Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society (RSACS) and implemented by Bal Sansar Sanstha in Ajmer district, completed its first full year of operation in FY 2024-25 (April 2024 – March 2025).

The project delivers HIV prevention, harm reduction, and health linkage services through a Drop-in Centre (DIC-equipped with a TV, indoor games, drinking water, and toilet facility and 8 trained Peer Educators covering 8 hotspots across Ajmer city, Kishangarh, and surrounding areas.

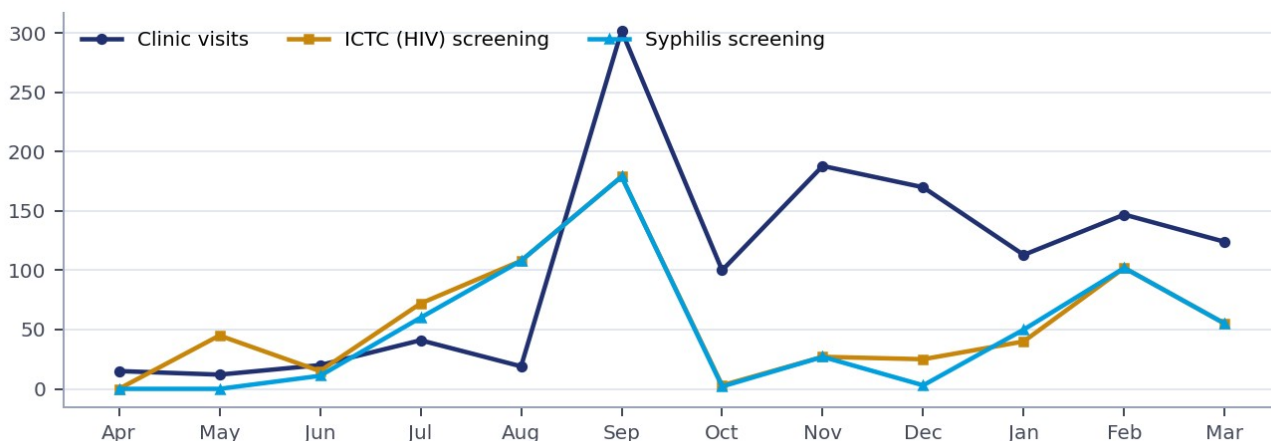
### Commodity Distribution — FY 2024-25

During FY 2024-25: 69,475 condoms and 1,63,499 needle-syringe units were distributed to IDUs across all hotspots, used ones were collected back regularly and disposed safely through contracting a licensed waste management agency. This represents consistent harm-reduction coverage throughout the year, helping reduce the transmission of HIV and other blood-borne infections.

### Month-wise Service Delivery Trends — FY 2024-25

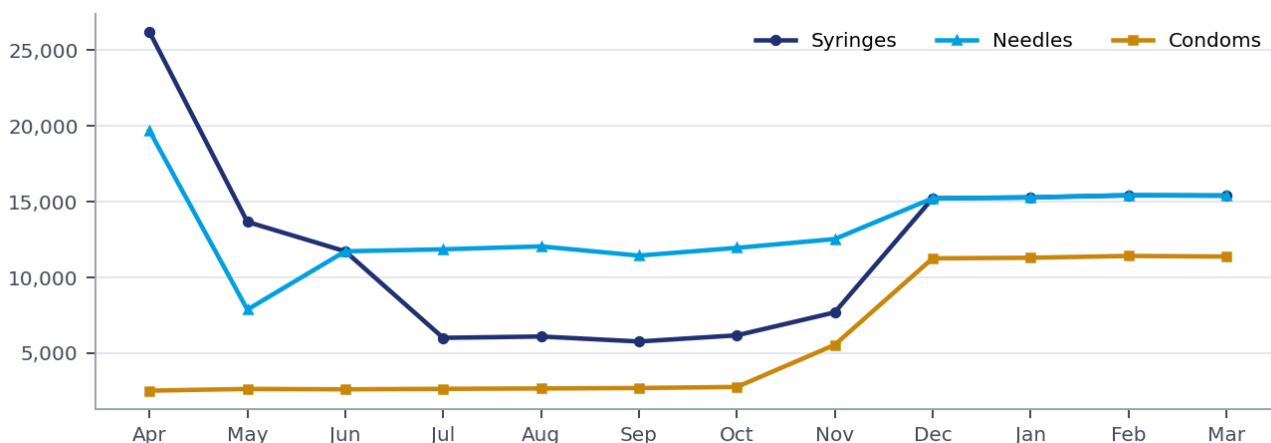
Clinic attendance increased sharply in the second half of the year — from an average of about 21 visits a month between April and August to more than 160 a month from September onwards, totalling 1,251 clinic visits for the year. HIV (ICTC) and syphilis screening drives peaked in August–September, with 671 ICTC and 597 syphilis screenings completed in all. Commodity distribution likewise stepped up substantially in the second half: monthly condom distribution rose from roughly 2,600 pieces in the first half to over 11,000 from December, and needle-syringe distribution also increased steadily through the winter months.

## Project Outcomes

- Measurable reduction in blood-borne disease risk among people who inject drugs through harm reduction services.
- Increased uptake of HIV testing and treatment services among the IDU community in Ajmer.
- Successful referrals to rehabilitation programmes for individuals seeking substance abuse support.
- Strengthened social support networks and reduced stigma within hotspot communities through regular DIC meetings and community engagement.
- 6 new HIV-positive individuals identified; 5 (83%) linked to ART services.
- OST (Opioid Substitution Therapy) provided to 27 individuals on an ongoing basis.

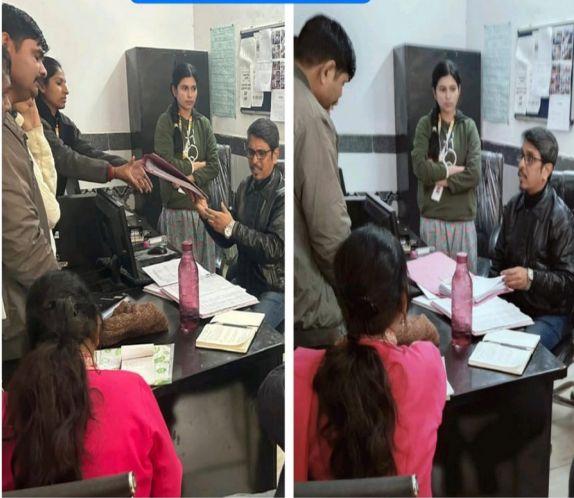

## c. Aarogyam: Community-Based Health & Wellbeing Centre

### New Project — Commenced January 2025

Funded by Cochin Shipyard Ltd (CSL), Kochi | CSR Grant: ₹40,00,000 (Forty Lakh) | Partnership Agreement signed: 29 November 2024

Aarogyam (meaning 'complete health and wellbeing' in Hindi) is a new flagship project that will create a dedicated 1,500 sq. ft. community health centre on the BSS campus in Hathikhera, Ajmer. The centre will serve women, adolescents, children, and families from the most vulnerable households in the area.

### Project Objectives

- Anaemia prevention and nutrition awareness, targeting women, children, and adolescents.
- Comprehensive health services: general check-ups, immunisation, and disease prevention.
- De-addiction counselling: yoga, naturopathy, stress management, and community sessions.
- Mental health and reproductive health awareness through SBCC activities.
- Community empowerment through education, expert counselling, and health-seeking behaviour change.
- Health monitoring and follow-up system for enrolled community members.
- Nutritional linkages with government nutrition schemes.

### d. Sambal: Skill & Entrepreneurship Development Institute (SEDI) — Update

Sambal SEDI has been a flagship skill-development initiative of BSS since 2013, offering computer education (RS-CIT), financial literacy, sewing and embroidery courses, and micro-enterprise support. During 2024-25, we enrolled 35 students in the RS-CIT programme.

However, the Government of Rajasthan revised the minimum qualification threshold for RS-CIT to Class 10 pass, which our target demographic — primarily out-of-school youth from marginalised households — does not meet. As a result, the RKCL-affiliated SEDI centre was not renewed for 2025-26.



Over its years of operation, SEDI helped over 300 youth complete RS-CIT and sewing certificate programmes. BSS remains committed to skill development and is exploring alternative channels including NSDC-affiliated programmes and vocational training partnerships with polytechnic colleges for revival in FY 2025-26.

## V. ASSOCIATIONS AND TIE-UPS

---

### a. Rajasthan State AIDS Control Society (RSACS)

---

RSACS funds BSS's Target Intervention for Injectable Drug Users in Ajmer district. The project, now in its second year of implementation (FY 2025-26), has been designated a 'Learning Site' by RSACS / NACO — one of only six in the state — in recognition of its quality of implementation. RSACS conducts regular supervisory visits, provides capacity-building training for all TI staff, and monitors project performance against quarterly targets.

### b. Cochin Shipyard Ltd (CSL)

---

Cochin Shipyard Ltd, Kochi — represented by Head (CSR) Sh. Sambath Kumar P N — is BSS's newest CSR partner. Their grant of ₹40 Lakh is funding the construction of the Aarogyam Community Health Centre at the BSS campus, Hathikhera. The partnership agreement was signed on 29 November 2024. The CSR team visited the site in October 2024 and has been actively engaged throughout the construction process.

### c. U and N Foundation

---

The U and N Foundation (New Delhi) provided a grant of ₹4.5 Lakh to support staff salaries at Bal Sansar Public School during FY 2024-25. This grant has been instrumental in retaining qualified teachers and maintaining educational quality.

### d. Smile Foundation

---

Smile Foundation has been a partner of BSS since 2017, working in the area of social venture philanthropy. During FY 2024-25, Smile Foundation continued its engagement with BSS through its partnership framework.

### e. Mitsubishi Elevator India Pvt. Ltd.

---

Mitsubishi Elevator India Pvt. Ltd. funded two digital smart classrooms at BSPS, inaugurated on 22 March 2024. During 2024-25, these classrooms have been fully operational, enabling digital and interactive learning for students from all classes. The smart boards and digital infrastructure have significantly enhanced the quality of education delivered at BSPS.

### f. GiveIndia

---

BSS maintains its registered fundraiser profile on GiveIndia's platform. Under a signed MoU with GiveIndia Foundation, BSS conducts online fundraising campaigns and receives individual donor contributions. BSS holds a 4-star transparency rating and Bronze Certificate from GiveIndia.



## VI. PLANS AHEAD

---

The future activities of BSS will be focused on continuing and expanding our community services, strengthening donor relationships, and developing the BSS campus to serve more beneficiaries.

### **Aarogyam Health Centre Completion**

Complete construction and commission the Aarogyam kendra by September 2025. Inaugurate the centre, recruit a doctor and health staff, and launch health and nutrition programmes for women and children.

### **TI-IDU Programme Continuation**

Continue the RSACS-funded Target Intervention programme into Year 3 (April 2025 onwards), building on our 'Learning Site' designation. Expand peer educator coverage and strengthen HIV testing uptake and ART linkage.

### **BSPS — Enrolment and Quality**

Maintain and grow BSPS enrolment beyond 151 students. Introduce academic enrichment programmes for board exam preparation, and explore additional digital learning resources.

### **SEDI Revival**

Explore alternative skill development channels including NSDC-affiliated programmes, partnerships with polytechnic colleges, and vocational courses aligned with employment market needs in Rajasthan.

### **Resource Mobilisation**

Submit proposals for CSR grants and government schemes to fund campus development — including a community hall, additional classrooms for BSPS, and sports infrastructure. Expand individual donor base through GiveIndia and direct campaigns.
